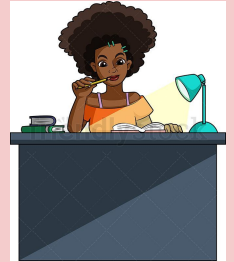

WE USE PRESENT SIMPLE TO TALK ABOUT...

- ★ Something that is **true** in the present:
 - I'm thirty six years old.
 - I'm a teacher.
 - He is a student.



- ★ Something that **happens regularly** in the present:
 - *I **play** football every saturday.*
 - *She studies all week.*



- ★ something that is **always true**:
 - *The human body **contains** 206 bones.*
 - *The sun **rises** in the east.*

The spelling for the verb in the third person differs depending on the ending of that verb:

1. For verbs that end in **-O**, **-CH**, **-SH**, **-SS**, **-X**, or **-Z** we add **-ES** in the third person.

go - goes

buzz - buzzes

catch - catches

wash - washes

fix - fixes

kiss - kisses

For verbs that end in a **consonant + Y**, we remove the **Y** and add **-IES**.

- marry - marries
- study - studies
- carry - carries
- worry - worries



For verbs that end in a **vowel + Y**, we just add **-S**.

- play - plays
- enjoy - enjoys
- say - says

We use **DON'T / DOESN'T** with all verbs **EXCEPT To Be**
(AM-IS-ARE)

★ You speak English.

She speaks English

★ You **don't** speak English.

She **doesn't** speak English
